# What will it take to close the gender gap in the arts?

Women and non-binary artists continue to be drastically underrepresented in the Canadian and global arts landscape.

- Women make up only 5% of artists in the auction market
- Of over 3,000 surveyed galleries, **10% represent not a single** woman artist and half represent 25% or fewer women
- Only **24%** of the over 27,000 artists shown in art fairs in 2018 were women.
- Just **11% of acquisitions** and 14.9% of exhibitions at 31 major US museums from 2008–2020 were women
- In Canada, women visual artists earn on average just **65% of the** annual income of their male peers

Racialized, low-income and 2SLGBTQ+ women and non-binary artists face even greater challenges in establishing themselves in the arts.

- Black women artists represent just 0.1% of auction sales
- Work by Black American women comprises just **0.5% of** acquisitions at the leading 31 US art museums
- Of the top 20 female artists sold at auction, 17 are white

TBA was founded by a group of women and mothers who believe that art should not only be central to our communities, but reflect their diversity.

From its outset, TBA has committed to showcasing artists that have for too long been marginalized and underrepresented.

Of the 37 exhibition artists that TBA will feature in 2024, 29 (78%) identify as women or non-binary. Further, all of the artists featured in the Biennial identify as Black, Indigenous, or People of Colour.

TBA believes firmly in the need for equitable representation of artists in contemporary art and is committed to creating opportunities for marginalized artists to thrive and reach new audiences.

Women and non-binary artists from diverse backgrounds need our support to create and exhibit work that speaks to the moment, challenges us, fosters dialogue and helps us to imagine a more equitable future. Women Leading brings together advocates for gender equity in the arts to create and exhibit new, innovative contemporary artworks, public programming, and learning experiences led by women and non-binary artists.

The passionate champions of Women Leading enable TBA to provide direct support to women and non-binary artists to create and showcase the work they dream of making and sharing with audiences. Projects supported to date include:

Judy Chicago, often called the 'Godmother' of Feminist Art, drew over 22,000 people to Toronto's waterfront to experience a newly commissioned Smoke Sculpture<sup>™</sup> entitled **A Tribute to** *Toronto*. Working on water for the first time, Chicago and collaborators released a series of pigmented smokes from a massive barge structure that mixed with wind and light to create myriad colour effects (pictured below).

**Camille Turner** combined Afrofuturism and historical research to create *Nave*, an immersive multimedia installation that explores the entanglement of colonial Canada in the transatlantic trade of enslaved Africans (pictured above). The work was awarded TBA's 2022 Artist Prize and has since been **acquired by the National Gallery of Canada**.



For the upcoming 2024 Biennial edition, Women Leading will support a diverse group of women and non-binary artists to create new works and showcase work yet to be seen by audiences in Canada and Toronto. These projects will include:

TBA will bring a site-specific version of UK artist **Sonia Boyce's** *Feeling Her Way* (2022) to Canada, presented in collaboration with the Art Gallery of Ontario and PHI Foundation for Contemporary Art. Awarded the **Golden Lion** *for Best National Participation at the 59th Venice Biennale*, the installation combines video, collage, music, and sculpture to present a body of work that centres around the vocal experimentation of five female musicians (pictured below).

**Cecilia Vicuña** (Chile) is a visual artist, poet, filmmaker, and activist who was recently awarded the **Golden Lion for Lifetime Achievement at the 59th Venice Biennale**. She created the autonomous concept of "precarious art" in the mid-1960s in Chile to name what vanishes. Her work bridges art and poetry as a way of "hearing an ancient silence waiting to be heard." For TBA 2024, Vicuña is developing a project that connects her fight against the military dictatorship in Chile (1973-1990) and the current struggles against fake news and other forms of manipulations that undermine democratic legitimacy.
